CCOE SUPERINTENDENT SPOTLIGHT



Michael P. West Colusa County Superintendent of Schools

With over 35 years of experience in the field of Education, Colusa County Superintendent of Schools Michael P. West has a breadth of knowledge and expertise in the areas of leadership, building community partnerships, and the practice of family literacy development. A graduate of Black Hills State University in Spearfish, South Dakota, West has a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education with a Minor in Physical Science. In 2012 he obtained his Master's Degree in Educational Leadership from Brandman University of the Chapman University System.

Superintendent West's career history in education is expansive. In Arkansas City (Kansas), he held teaching positions in the fields of science, chemistry, and aeronautics. After moving to Colusa County in 1986, West became involved in community activities, gaining memberships with the City of Colusa Planning Commission, National Association of Flight Instructors, Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association and Airport Support Network representative for Colusa County, Colusa County Airport Advisory and Land Use Committee, and the Colusa Rotary Club. In 1988, Superintendent West was the Mayor of the City of Colusa and in 1997, was named President of the California Interscholastic

Federation for the Northern Section and served as the Vice President of the Colusa County Economic Development Corporation.

West believes his desire to educate all children, teachers, parents, and citizens is his true calling and this is evident in his teaching career in Colusa County. As the Director of Athletics & Activities at Colusa High School, Superintendent West taught the Regional Occupational Program's Introduction to Aerospace course, and physical science and education classes while coaching baseball and football. He then went on to hold the positions of Assistant Principal of Colusa's High School and Alternative School, and was Summer School Principal for Colusa County Migrant Education before being elected to his current office of Colusa County Superintendent of Schools.

As Superintendent of Schools, West stated that it's his mission to "continually educate myself, my staff, and others through communication, cooperation, collaboration, and education as the elected leader of the Colusa County Office of Education."

When not meeting with community groups, creating professional development opportunities, and leading and supporting staff, West loves spending time with his wife of 43 years (Janis), their three children (Amber, Austin, Adler), and grandchildren (Anden and Quincy). He enjoys watching and attending sporting events, and was recently inducted into the Black Hills State University Athletic Hall of Fame as a pitcher of the 1977 and 1978 Baseball Teams. Achieving a 2nd Degree Black Belt in Taekwondo and Hapkido, Superintendent West makes a point to continue his practice of the eastern arts.
